In Christmas and the Epiphany season we celebrate Christ, the light of the world, in whom we see the face of God. In Christ, we see the abundant benevolence of God, Godøs loving-kindness, full of mercy and compassion. In him, we do not see an angry, hateful God but a patient God who forgives. In him, we do not see an almighty, aloof God but God who is God-with-us, God who takes the last place, God who turns the other cheek, a God who loves ó even those who donøt love him. *In his light we see light*.

But the Epiphany story does not end there. The Epiphany story, that we celebrate this February, continues with us. For once, says St. Paul, "you were darkness but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light – for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. (Ephesians 5:8-9)

We are being called, in the scripture passages of February, not just to be a community of believers in Jesus but to be a community of disciples of Jesus that walk in his way of light. We are called to become imitators of God. As Paul implores the community in Ephesus, õPut away all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you." (Ephesians 4:31-5:1)

Jesusø and the apostle Pauløs core teachings are that there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God and that, in Christ, there are no more divisions between humans and other humans. More than ever, the world needs this light. Our world is devolving into binary tribal mentalities sped up and enlarged by the õtwitterverseö and zealots of all persuasions. People are cruelly judged and segregated through the filters of us versus them, republican versus democrat, citizen versus migrant, Jew versus Christian, black versus police and on and on and oní

Love one another <u>as yourself</u> ó that way they will know you are my disciples. Not, <u>as much as yourself</u>, as if we are still separate entities, but love one another <u>as yourself</u>, as an extension of your own being, as part of one body. (1 Corinthians 12:12-13) In that way, you will be light.

Faith, as it turns out, is not holding onto some doctrinal beliefs, it is a pathway of spiritual formation based on transformative practices of love, a way of life that needs to be learned


125th St. Peter's Birthday Party
