

Message from Fr. Morris

Dear People of St. Peter's,

In times of trial, the better part of wisdom is to seek our resources that will help us deal more successfully with what we face.

This pandemic season we are enduring, is very likely to be "more of a marathon run than a sprint" according to Bishop Carlye Hughes. We and the rest of the nation and world are in the midst of a trial, both in the sense of personal challenge as well as the "testing" of our patience, of our endurance, our character, and our social systems. Even plans to loosen any social distancing restrictions are most likely to be phased in gradually over an extended period. We are called to "endure" as creatively and gracefully as we can.

Most of Jewish and Christian wisdom for living was forged in times of trial. The words of St. James, the "brother of the Lord" ring true for our situation: "My brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind . . . know that the testing of your faithfulness produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing." (James 1:2-4) What we make of times of trial is part of the making of our own souls.
