Matthew 22:34-40

The Greatest Commandment

³⁴ When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, ³⁵ and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. ³⁶ "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" ³⁷ He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the greatest and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

- How might we act if we love God?
- Who do you think Jesus means when he uses the word neighbor?
- How might we act if we love our neighbors?
- Why did Jesus say that the entire Law of Moses and the prophets depends on loving God and loving our neighbors?
- How would the world be different if everyone followed Jesus' teaching about love?
- When is it hard to love?
- When is it easy to love?
- Name one way we can love God or our neighbor.
