

Epiphanytide Blessing: Chalking the Doors

All gather at the west doors of the church. As Epiphanytide begins, Christians throughout the world use chalk, which has been blessed, to write the letters "CMB" and the calendar year on their doorway in a traditional Epiphany celebration. The letters represent the traditional names of the Magi—Caspar, Melchior, Balthazar—and could also stand for the Latin blessing: 'Christus mansionem benedicat'—meaning 'May Christ bless this house.'

As the Procession begins, the Choir sings this Introit

Choir I was glad when they said unto me,

We will go into the house of the LORD.

Our feet shall stand in thy gates, O Jerusalem.

Jerusalem is built as a city that is at unity in itself.

For thither the tribes go up, even the tribes of the LORD,

to testify unto Israel, to give thanks unto the Name of the LORD.

For there is the seat of judgment, even the seat of the house of David.

O pray for the peace of Jerusalem; they shall prosper that love thee.


Peace be within thy walls, and plenteousness within thy palaces.

For my brethren and companions' sakes, I will wish thee prosperity.


Yea, because of the house of the LORD our God, I will seek to do thee good.


First Reading Isaiah 43:1-7

Presider

Dear People of God: We who are followers of Christ have been received through our baptism into his Body, the communion of saints. As we remember Jesus' baptism, I call upon you now to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived

by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the

communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the

body, and the life everlasting.

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin,

repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in

Christ?

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the

dignity of every human being?

Invitation

Presider The gifts of God for the People of God.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Bread and Cup to be in communion with God and each other. You may receive only the bread by placing your hands together flat in front of you (Gluten-free wafers are available upon request). Afterwards you may drink wine from the chalice. If you would rather have the bread intincted (dipped) in the wine, you may hand the bread to the person administering the chalice and they will intinct and hand it back to you. If you (or your child) would rather not receive the Sacrament, you may come to the altar rail during Communion and cross your arms on your chest for a blessing.
